





01 Sites of Interest

Located near the Acheron River, this site provides a glimpse into ancient Greek beliefs and practices.

Syvota: Visit the coastal town of Syvota and take a boat trip to the nearby islands of Paxos and Antipaxos. These islands are known for their crystal-clear waters, charming villages, and vibrant marine life.
