### 01 Sites of Interest

**Sarakiniko Beach:** Explore the lunarlike landscape of Sarakiniko Beach, characterized by white volcanic rocks and turquoise waters. This iconic spot is perfect for swimming, sunbathing, and capturing breathtaking photos.

**Firopotamos Village:** Firopotamos is a traditional fishing village with small, colorful boat garages carved into the rocks. Stroll along the narrow pathways, admire the quaint houses, and enjoy the serene atmosphere by the sea.

**Kleftiko:** Accessible only by boat, Kleftiko is a collection of sea caves and rock formations along Milos' coastline. Take a boat tour to marvel at the crystalclear waters, swim in secluded coves, and explore the unique geological features.
